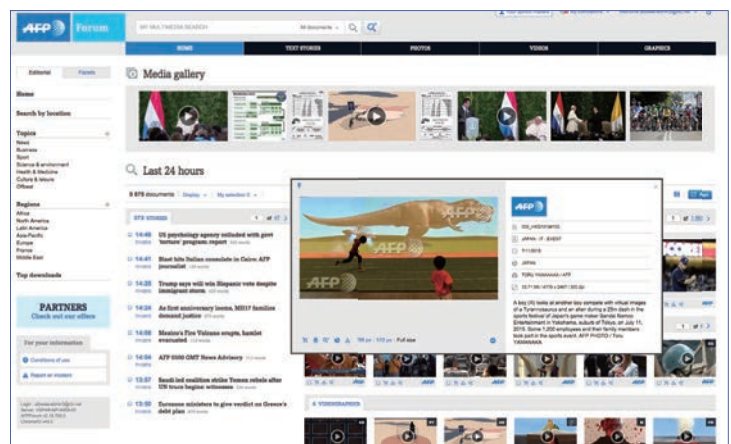
AFPWAA is a database service for educational institutions, offering unrestricted access to a wealth of photos and video footage on a wide variety of news topics from the past 170 years.

News Agency's Database at a Special Price for Academia

AFPWAA is offering access to the journalistic database of one of the world's oldest news agencies, Agence France-Presse (AFP, established in 1835), at a special price for academics in Japan. Via college and university networks, you can access AFP archives filled with the same news photos, video footage, and text articles that are distributed to more than 13,000 media outlets around the world.

Stock Images: Ten Million Photos and 100,000 News Videos

Through its news gathering activities over the past 170 years, AFP has established one of the world's largest collections of photographic images. AFPWAA's archive contains more than ten million news photos and 100,000 videos. This archive is excellent for providing visual materials for academic work or enhancing language learning curricula. Powerful search tools provide horizontal search across photos, video and text articles covering a wide variety of academic and research fields. And, it can provide verification of facts from past to present, which can be difficult to obtain from conventional research sources.

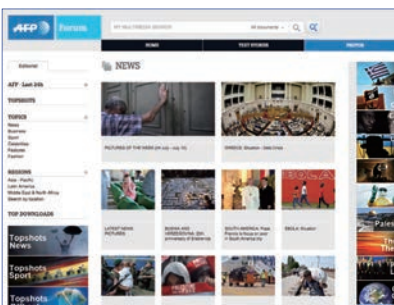


Licensed for Secondary Use of Copyrighted Work

All material in the archive is licensed for secondary use of copyrighted work in academia. Researchers and students can download photos, video and text articles, as well as browse, search and print.

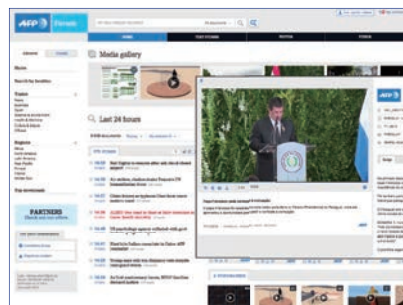
All material can be used freely in reports, research papers and presentations.

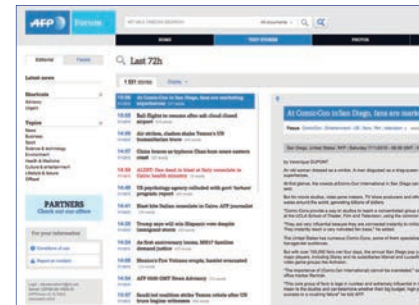
PHOTOS • GRAPHICS

AFP's Image Forum is one of the largest digital photo archives in the world. It contains a vast amount of visual material covering all categories of news from the past 170 years. It includes a fee-based service called "Partner Photos", which provides photos collected from affiliated news and photo agencies.

VideoForum is a 24/7 news video service delivering footage from 165 countries in seven languages (English, French, German, Spanish, Portuguese, Polish and Arabic). Besides their research and presentation potential, these videos are ideal for integrating in language learning materials, as all include written scripts.

5. Please click "I accept" button on the bottom of the page "General conditions for using the AFP Forum site".

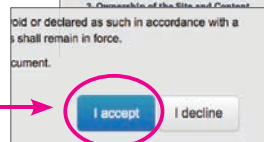
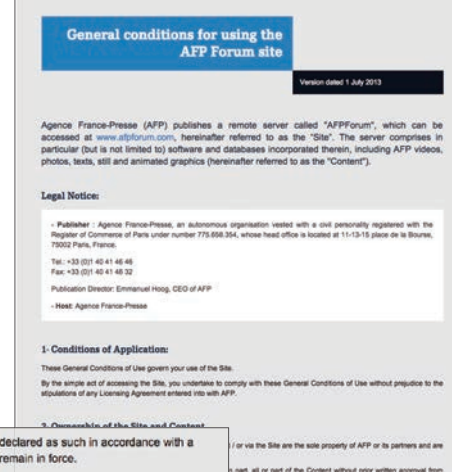
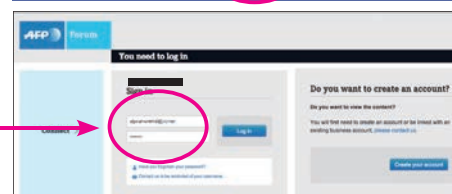
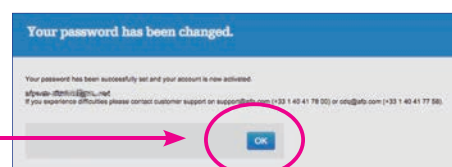
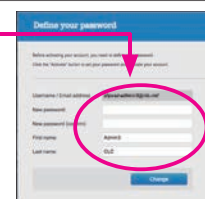
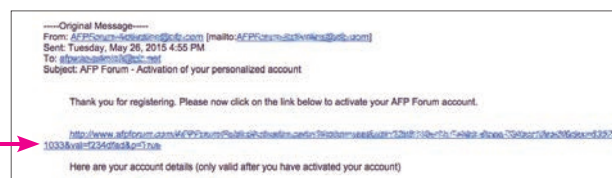
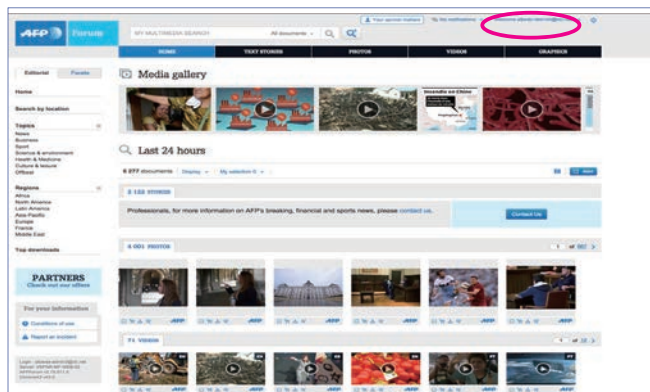
